# ST JAMES' C OF E PRIMARY SCHOOL Pupil Premium Provision Report 2019/20

# Overview of the school

In 2019-2020, 50% of pupils at St James' are classified as Ever 6. This is over double the national average of 24.1%. It is vital that the attainment and progress of Pupil Premium pupils at the school is no different to that of non-Pupil Premium children at the school and that all children, Pupil Premium or non-Pupil Premium, are achieving at expected or above expected levels nationally.

This is a breakdown of how the school used its Pupil Premium funding in 2019 – 2020. This is funding allocated to the school and is based on the number of pupils who have been eligible for Free School Meals in the last six years (Ever6). Funding is allocated separately in the nursery (EYPP).

# Impact of pupil premium in key focus area – Mathematics

## Implement a whole school approach to mastery

## Actions:

- New whole school approach to mastery
- CPD courses for specific staff
- Change to planning template
- Audit of mathematics resources
- Math observations regularly carried out by Subject Lead and SLT

#### Outcome:

- Staff confident and positive on change to mastery curriculum
- Positive feedback relayed to all class teachers from staff attending CPD
- Positive reception to planning template from all staff
- On-going updating of Maths resources
- Maths observations either at 'good' or 'outstanding' with constructive feedback provided

## Parent/carer engagement

#### Actions:

- Focus on reward for effort, perseverance and resilience
- Parent meetings on new Year 4 times tables assessment
- Personal invitations written to parents/carers by children for Maths events
- Parent courses with teachers on areas of curriculum that parents find difficult to support
- Maths day linking Maths to other areas of the curriculum

#### Outcome:

- Change to reward approach in Maths positively received by children
- Positive response from parents
- Maths day and further Maths events– not possible due to COVID-19
- Parent courses not possible due to COVID-19

## Improvement of arithmetic skills in lower Key Stage 2

## Actions:

- Using technology to improve arithmetic skills: Mathletics, times tables rock stars etc.
- Maths tutoring for Year 5
- Dedicated 15 minutes to arithmetic skills, in class, each day
- Changes to Maths culture across wider school community

#### Outcome:

- Wider use of technology positively received by children, some unable to access, which is something that will be addressed next year
- 15 minutes arithmetic sessions widely introduced and successful
- Maths tutoring unable to take place due to COVID-19
