Gates - Drop offs and Collections

At Alexis St please do wait outside the gates where your child/ren line up – i.e. Belgium, Years 3 & 4 use the gate nearest to the school building and Years 5 & the gate nearest to the garden/furthest from the school building.

Access at Alexis Street

Please note that there is NO access to Linsey street at drop off and collection times. Cars must be left before the entrance to Alexis St, by Macks Road. We still have the temporary barrier but soon the ANPR will be in force, and you will receive a ticket if you enter during the restricted times. The barrier is in place for the safety of all our children, and we thank you for your consideration.

Alexis St Gates – Drop offs and Collections

Many thanks for your continued co-operation and patience while waiting for children at the gates for collections at the end of the day. Things have still been swift and efficient, however another reminder please to wait outside the gates where your child/ren line up – i.e. Belgium, Years 3 & 4 use the gate nearest to the school building and Years 5 & 6 the gate nearest to the garden/furthest from the school building. The gate nearer the school building gets quite congested at times so it's good to spread out and wait for a second until children have pointed you out to their teacher. Many thanks for your co-operation.

PE Days/PE Kit

Another reminder of children's PE days, upon which they should attend school WEARING their PE kits: *Tuesdays – Years 1 & 2; Wednesdays – Years 3 & 4; Thursdays – Years 5, 6 & Reception.* Children in Belgium class at Key Stage Two should wear their PE kits according to their appropriate age-related year group above. We know our supplier doesn't have full availability of kit at the moment – I've told lots of parents and carers that plain, suitable PE clothes with a respectful nod to our uniform is fine and we completely understand this if you're having difficulty obtaining the uniform kit!

Yoga Lessons

Thanks to Mr. Brenta and his link to the London PE network, we've managed to book some Yoga lessons this half term which will start next week. On these days, children will need to wear their PE kits. Every child will have an hour-long lesson over a three-week period as below. Reception, Years 3 and 4 have their lessons on their normal PE days, however do note the dates for other year groups to wear PE kits to school for an additional day:

- Tuesdays 20th Sept, 27th Sept and 4th Oct Years 5 & 6 Yoga Lessons. PE kit to be worn on these Tuesdays as well as Thursdays for PE.
- Wednesdays 21st Sept, 28th Sept, 5th Oct Years 3 & 4 Yoga Lessons. PE kits worn as normal on Wednesdays; no change.
- Thursdays 22nd Sept, 29th Sept & 6th Oct Years Reception, 1 & 2 Yoga Lessons. No change for Reception; normal PE day. Years 1 & 2 to wear PE kits on these additional Thursdays as well as their normal Tuesday PE days.

School Uniform

Punctuality

We have noticed again a number of children are arriving increasingly late every morning. It may seem like 10 minutes isn't really that much, but for a typical school day of 6.5 hours, a pupil who is late by 10 minutes every day will miss 30 hours of school time over the year. The impact on the class is even larger, as if more than one pupil is late the whole class get disrupted more than once. Being late means your child may miss vital information and more importantly their learning time, meaning they have to try and catch up with the rest of the class, and of course the teacher will not always have time to repeat what has already been taught. This is a problem across both sites. We do know and completely understand that sometimes it is unavoidable, and a call or text/e-mail to the office to let us know means we won't be chasing you to see why your child is not in school, so please do let us know if there is an unavoidable delay and you are running late. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

<u>SchoolsBuddy Booking System - OJR Breakfast and After-School Club</u>

Can we respectfully remind parents who use Breakfast & After School Club at OJR that they need to book and pay for sessions in advance of children attending. We have a legal obligation to provide the correct child:adult ratio at sessions and this cannot be achieved if we don't know how many children are due to attend. Children not booked in may be turned away if we cannot safely supervise due to excess numbers. Equally, we have - up until now - refunded parents for sessions which have been booked by them but then not attended by their children. The SchoolsBuddy app shows where parents can go back on and cancel sessions, at which point money for the session unused will be credited to their account for use on a future booking.

SchoolsBuddy offers flexibility for parents to book or cancel sessions through the app or through the browser online at any time of the day or night. Sessions can be booked or cancelled up to the minute they start. The system was introduced by school to enable parents to be in charge of their own bookings. We do not intend to continue manually booking and charging sessions required nor crediting sessions not required on behalf of parents, due to the additional work this involves our administrative staff. If you have any issues accessing SchoolsBuddy, please email office@st-james.southwark.sch.uk and we will be happy to ensure that you have the functionality required to manage your Schoolsbuddy account and bookings. Thank you.

NEU Strike Action

I'm happy to say that no member of the NEU in our setting has informed us they are taking industrial action on Wednesday 1st February, meaning **school will be open as usual.** Should this change for next Wednesday, or any of the other planned strike days, we will let you know as soon as possible. Should members strike, we anticipate being able to cover their absence as we usually would a class teachers' illness.

School Streets – Alexis St

We are very pleased that, after many months of consultation and campaigning, we will soon have the ANPR camera installed at Alexis St, meaning Mrs Brenta will no longer have to stand by the barriers that restrict access to vehicles during drop off and pick up times at KS2. During this lengthy period, it has made the road and pavement behind the playground so very much safer, although we are aware there is still the possibility of some vehicles on the road - usually deliveries or residents. We would like to thank the school community for their consideration over the past couple of years while we have had the barrier. Those of you who do drive should be very used to not coming through the barrier zone. I know Mrs Brenta has been telling you about the ANPR and the possible fine you may get.

The temporary barriers will be in place for a little while longer, although we have been informed by Southwark Council that the ANPR camera will go 'live' very soon. There will be restricted timings, during drop off and collection, the same as we have had with the barrier, where any vehicle going into the area (beyond the current barrier) will be issued a 'Fixed Penalty Notice' with a fine. Unfortunately, children arriving late for school has increased over the past few weeks. Please be reminded of our start times: KS2 (Alexis St) - gates open at 08:50 and the day begins at 08:55. Children arriving after the registers have closed (09:30 at KS2 and 09:45 at KS1) will be marked with an unauthorised absence (unless they have attended an appointment). When children are late it is disruptive for the whole class, and can sometimes be upsetting for the child who is late. Often the teacher has delivered instructions for the day and lessons have begun. We know sometimes this cannot be avoided; in these rare instances, do call ahead to let us know we can mark the register accordingly.

Driving/Parking at Old Jamaica Road

We are very proud of holding a sustainable travel award, and would like to remain on GOLD. Sadly, there is an increasing number of cars parking near OJR. Sustainable Travel mans to walk, cycle or scoot and leave the car at home. We are aware that of course some of you are dropping off and going on to work so may need your car. Where possible though, please leave your car at home or parked away from school and complete your journey on foot. KS1 has a lot of very small children and their safety is of the utmost importance to us here at school. Mrs. Brenta, along with a number of parents, who works hard on the School Travel Plan, has been shocked by the number of cars parked (and on the zig zags or double yellow lines) outside the church, and has asked that you reconsider your journey to and from school and choose to travel on foot, bike or scooter. The traffic at Alexis St has certainly decreased since the barriers and ANPR cameras have been in place - for that we thank you, the children reported to Mrs. Brenta how much safer they feel when coming to and from school.

Newsletter 23rd June 2023 Dear Parents & Carers,

Year 6 School Journey - Monday-Wednesday Next Week
