This week children have amazed us with their skills and enthusiasm in both French and Relationship & Health Education (RHE). Do ask them all about everything they are learning in school!

Year 1 had a terrific 'Teddy Bear Hospital' workshop on Wednesday delivered by practitioners from King's College Hospital; 3 Norway, 2 Spain and Reception have all attended the library for story-telling and book swapping and Years 2 & 5 are participating in really interesting safety workshops delivered by the London Fire Brigade in school today.

Our Collective Worship theme has continued to focus on some Old Testament stories and people - this week with Jacob. Next term we'll continue to learn all about the Old Testament and the connections and lessons we can learn from the Bible before Jesus came.
