Dear Parents & Carers,

We come to the end of Spring term 1 and children have been amazing us with their Religious Education knowledge and engagement this week! School Day Timings - September 2024

I'm writing with plenty of warning to inform you of some tweaks we have to make to our school day timings next academic year. As you know, we have to stagger to ensure siblings can be on time between sites etc. Because our younger children start later and finish earlier, I will have to action a change to ensure one site starts and finishes earlier, and the other starts and finishes later. From September, it will be statutory for all primary school children to be in school for 32.5 hours per week. The most obvious thing to happen would be to have OJR start and finish earlier (Early Years and KS1 get the most tired in the afternoon) and have Alexis St start later and finish later. Do feel free to give any feedback on this change – I'd really welcome your views or preferences. Please see the following document outlining why this change is necessary:
